

# KIWANIS DOLL PROJECT

The following is a list of materials needed to make the Kiwanis Hospital Dolls:

- ❑ Material . . . 50/50 Cotton and Poly Mix, 45" x 90" or wider. Color is dependant on your preference, but a **light color** is a must. (Examples: White, Off-White, Brown, Beige, Yellow, Pink, Blue, Purple and Mint Green). Prices range from \$1.99/yard up to \$5.99/yard.
- ❑ Stuffing . . . Non-toxic, Non-allergenic poly material, available at Wal-Mart or any craft store. 5 lb. box is most convenient and usually costs around \$8.00/box.
- ❑ Thread to match the material
- ❑ Straight Pins . . . Used to hold the material in place while cutting and sewing
- ❑ Pattern . . . can be obtained from the Kiwanis District and International offices
- ❑ Templates . . . Trace the Kiwanis doll pattern onto thick paper or cardboard. This makes it much easier later when you trace the pattern onto the material.
- ❑ Pens . . . To trace the templates
- ❑ Sharp Scissors
- ❑ A small container for the straight pins. *Be sure to remove all straight pins for safety reasons!*
- ❑ Clear plastic bags . . . Make sure the bags are big enough to accommodate a Kiwanis doll
- ❑ Ribbon or twist ties to close the bags
- ❑ Color Markers . . . Non-toxic
- ❑ Kiwanis Tags . . . Can be obtained from Kiwanis International
- ❑ Sewing Machines

What goes in the plastic bag with a Kiwanis Doll?

- ❑ Two Non-toxic color markers
- ❑ An informational sheet about the Kiwanis Doll Project (A template can be obtained from the Foundation office)
- ❑ Kiwanis/Sponsored Youth Promotional material
- ❑ Use your imagination! Some clubs report adding crossword puzzles, word searches and playing cards for the older children. The possibilities are endless!
